A	<p>OPENING & WELCOME KP opened the meeting and welcomed all present.</p>
B	<p>APOLOGIES & ATTENDANCE There were no apologies and the attendance register was circulated.</p>
C	<p>ADOPTION OF AGENDA No agenda was compiled for this meeting</p>
D	<p>PURPOSE OF THE MEETING KP outlined the purpose of the meeting and presented the project scope to the Councillors. The following topics were discussed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Project Description and layout; • COVID 19 Regulations; • Quarry 4 & 5 Ward 99; • Previous PP undertaken; • Traditional Leaders; • How can the councilors assist with informing the public; • Places to put up site notices; and • Community WhatsApp groups.
E	<p>DISCUSSION ON PROPOSED</p> <p>Quarry 6A</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAVN advised that there currently are existing Quarries along the Moloto Road which are very close to the existing proposed Quarries and why can't these be used. In particular the Quarry adjacent to the railway line. KP added that it is dependent on the material that is required and the quantities. • CFP advised on the timelines and by when will the projects commence. KP advised within the first quarter of 2021. Provided that the required Authorisations are in place. • CFP advised that blasting could be a concern as the adjacent plots are currently using groundwater. What will be the radius of the potential impact? CHC advised that when blasting is undertaken at the army camp this impacts on the resident's infrastructure. • CFP requested community upliftment in the area, eg re-gravelling of the Road, look at providing the CoT with G5 for upgrading of the CoT roads. Community upliftment and Job creation is important. There could be resistance from the informal settlement adjacent to the police station. • CFP can assist and provided the leaders at the informal settlement with the notification letters of the project. • CFP advised that dust will be a problem for the haulage of vehicles; • CFP advised that there are no traditional leaders within his ward; • CFP advised that the notices provided on WhatsApp shall rather be jpeg instead of a pdf; • CFP advised that site notices can be placed at the following sites: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Zambezi Mall

CHC advised that they have had previous discussions with First Land Development as there were previous discussion around mining activities in the area. The property is divided into four portions; ● CHC advised few things to be looked at, as the property has been proposed for township. Applications already lodged with the CoT. The township development was proposed in order to stop the mining of Vanadium. Vanadium cannot be allowed and agreed on township development. ● CHC advised the proposed site is environmentally sensitive, due to frogs, wetlands etc. ● CHC advised that the township establishment will definitely create jobs and uplift the area. ● CHC requested clarity as to whether the site will be used for mining or township development as the community will need to know were they stand as community members moved to the area for the serenity and now they have to endure the impacts of mining; ● CHC requested that the engineers advise on the type of backfilling that will be used as the property is proposed for township development. ● CHC added that blasting is a big concern, adjacent landowners as well as the petroport will be affected and how will material be hauled to the R573. Which routes will be used as there is a wetland on the property? KP advised that a Water Use Authorisation will be undertaken for the haulage of material on the existing access road as it traverses the wetland. CHC advised that there is a major problem with flooding in the area when it rains. ● CHC indicated that Transnet might also be affected and that previously Transnet also opposed mining in the area. There is also a proposed K6 highway and the CoT container hub in the area. ● CHC advised that the site notices can be placed at the following sites: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Doornpoort Spar, corner of Amandelboom and Dr van der Merwe Road ○ Corner of Airport Road and Dr Swanepoel Road ○ Wingtip Crossing, corner of Klippan Street and Dr Swanepoel Road ○ Doornpoort Centre, Airport road, ○ Bon Accord Spar, corner of Lavender and Graf Road ○ Dr Swanepool Road
